Proceed with Caution

The word caution is defined as "to avoid mistakes." In this advent season, we must proceed with caution to avoid making mistakes such as those that could lead our people to thinking that Christmas and Advent are the very same thing.

Remember, Advent is preparing for the first coming of Christ while anticipating the second coming and not just the birth of Christ. We celebrate the Birth of Jesus Christ during the Advent season. Proceed with Caution and remember Advent isn't a celebration, it's a time for preparation. Think of Advent as another Lent. Christmas is the celebration. Think of Christmas as another Easter.

May our worship services be Advent-focused, from the hymns to the litany to the preaching. Our *hope* is in Christ's coming and Christ's second coming that we will be found preceding with caution.

Proceed with Fun
